Applications will be taken in order of arrival and if you do not get a place now we can hold you on our waiting list for the next intake.



<u>Message about pupil attendance</u> We understand that absences due to sickness and unexpected circumstances are unavoidable, but there is a high level of absence due to term time holidays which is a cause for concern. This can have an affect on children's learning, and not just on the learning and progress of the children who are absent but also on other children.

When a child returns to school after a holiday their teacher has to spend time helping that child to catch-up on missed lessons and this, inevitably, means that the learning that has been planned for the whole class is affected. Whilst an isolated absence may have limited impact, the effect of frequent absences is significant.

For this reason and the negative impact that unnecessary absence has on children's social interactions, and on their perceptions of the importance of school education the governors ask parents not to take term time holidays.



### Laurel Residential next year

We currently haven't booked a residential for Laurel class next year due to a couple of concerns. Recently, one of the biggest residential providers in the country went into administration and lots of schools and parents lost the money they had paid. The issue is, all providers want you to pay deposits and then other money up front and we know parents (and school) aren't in the position to lose this money if providers go into administration. Also, when we approached our usual provider, they have put the prices up and this would impact parents when we know times are tough. Over the last few years, school have ended up paying towards the residentials and we cannot afford to continue to do this with our current budgets. If parents have any ideas or thoughts on this topic, we'd be keen to hear them and look for suggestions or solutions to overcome these issues.

### Parking at Drop off/pick up

A few parents have complained about some dangerous parking from two white BMWs parking on the zig zag lines, across the pavement and blocking next door's drive. The person who reported it thought they might be grandparents so please if you have other people doing the school run for you, can you pass on the messages about parking safely to protect all our school community. I do not want to be telling you about an injured child before the situation improves.
